

Thursday, May 21st

PK3

Religion: Continue to pray the “Hail Mary” and to learn the “Angel of God” prayer. Both will be practiced in our teaching video. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ptZyX6yelvE>

ELA: We will practice our Jolly Phonics’ sounds with the compact disc and props. We will especially concentrate on the letters Gg, Oo, Uu, Ll and Ff. This will involve the use of a dish strainer for Gg as the “water gurgles down the drain”, a lightswitch for the lights going on and off, an umbrella for “Up,up, up go umbrellas...when it starts to rain”, a lollipop for the jingle “We lick our lollipops” and lastly a blow up fish that “got a hole, the air came out, “ffffff.” Names will be chosen from the hat again and specific children will be asked to answer letter and sound association questions. It should be fun!

Math: Please complete the counting activity in Seesaw.

Science/Social Studies: For the topic of Social Studies I would like to explore community helpers who are helping the world right now through their service and commitment. In our learning video I will be making up “Who am I?” riddles and then I will be “calling on” children to answer. Names will be chosen from a separate hat than that of our Jolly Phonics’ questions. We will learn about the post office helpers, the grocery store helpers, the pet store helpers and the delivery drivers that work for companies such as Amazon. We will include doctors and nurses, policemen and firemen. Please complete the related Seesaw activity.

Physical Activity: Do 15 Jumping Jacks, 10 Frog Jumps and 10 Push Ups

Specials: For music practice we will sing, “Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes.” I will play this song on the class organ as we used to do in class. Please be ready to participate.

Write about a different emotion on Monday-Thursday. Please underline the verb (action word) in each sentence.
