Monday, March 30th:

PK3

Religion: Continue to practice the "Lord's Prayer" by use of this You Tube video. https://youtu.be/O78UfDkGhRs. Also, make sure that you are practicing the "Hail Mary" at least one time each day. In class we would hold a Cabbage Patch doll to signify Mary and a smaller infant doll to signify Baby Jesus. Tell your parents that you are happy for three things that God

has given you. Practice making the Sign of the Cross every time that you pray.

ELA: Go to You Tube and type in "Where the Wild Things Are" Read Aloud. Listen to the story (or if you have the book at home you may prefer to have an adult or older sibling read it to you.) Then, in your journals draw a picture of Max coming home in his boat on the water. Parents can help with this, perhaps sketching the outline of a simple picture that your child can then color in. This will lead into Mousie's next adventure for tomorrow, the letter W.

Math: Go to You Tube and enter in "Sorting Objects and Counting for Kids/Sorting Games. It is 4:55 minutes long. Then gather 20 objects of two different colors and sort them into two separate groups. You can further this concept by placing dolls and stuffed animals in a main center pile and then have your child sort dolls into one pile, and animals into another. Have your child use words and sentences as they do so to further add to their understanding as to what they are doing, such as "The unicorn goes in the animal pile because he is not a doll."

Science/Social Studies: Connecting back to our "My Big World" that we completed in class last month, have your child flap their arms very fast and pretend to fly from flower to flower collecting nectar, the sweet red juice that is inside of the flowers. If you wish you might allow your child to place pillows around the room and then visit each pillow, dunking their head into each pillow/ imaginary flower to drink the nectar. You Tube, "Hand feeding Hummingbirds", filmed in Alaska, 4:28, is a fantastic short clip that shows this.
