PK3

Religion: Continue to practice the “Angel of God” prayer using motions that we have been learning to help us to remember the words better. Sing: “Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so. Little ones to Him belong, they are weak but He is strong. Yes, Jesus loves me, yes Jesus loves me. Yes, Jesus loves me, the Bible tells me so.”

ELA: Continue to have 2 stuffed animals talk to each other, using eye contact between the animals. Have the animals (or dollies) practice giving each other compliments. For example, Big Bird might say to Grover, “I really like your fuzzy blue fur.’ And then, in turn, Big Bird might return the compliment by saying to Grover, “I really love your pink fuzzy nose.”

Math: Count how many fingers and toes you have in all! Are there groupings of five like we have been noticing a lot lately?

Science: Practice being a hummingbird and flapping your wings very fast. Arrange pillows on your floor and push your nose deep into the pillows to pretend you are pulling out sweet yummy nectar with your long beak. Say, “Yummy, yummy, in my tummy!” Then rub your belly in a circular motion.

Music Super Fun: Check out these children singing “The Yellow Submarine” for a real school performance! It’s so super cute! Sing along with them and don’t forget to plug your nose for the going underwater parts. I think you will really love this one. Mrs. Wilder sent it to me, for you!
