

Wednesday, April 8th

PK3

Religion: Continue to practice the “Glory be to the Father” song and “Jesus Loves Me, This I Know.” Practice making the Sign of the Cross. Close your eyes and imagine Jesus coming to stand next to you. Spread your fingers wide apart to stand for the palms that were waved at him on his special parade day and say, “I believe in you Jesus! I believe that you are the Son of God.” Wave your fingers at him, as if they were palms.

ELA: In your journals draw a picture of a brown bunny with a circular face and tall oval ears on top of his or her head. The caption will be: “Here Comes the Easter Bunny!” His nose should be a triangle and he should have two long rectangular teeth. Draw him holding a square basket full of Easter eggs of bright Spring colors, such as green, pink, yellow and blue. Color green grass below him, a blue sky above and a bright circular yellow sun within the blue sky.

Math: Continue to practice with ABC, ABC, ABC patterns using toys. For example, you might arrange them as such and say, “Red, blue, green. Pattern starts over again! Red, blue, green, pattern starts over again!” Optional: Arrange three objects by size order: “Biggest, medium, smallest.” This was shown in this morning’s video with seashells.

Science/Social Studies: Pretend to be a rabbit burrowing (digging) into the ground. Pretend to pull carrots out of the ground and to eat them. Pretend to be the Mommy or Daddy and pull your baby close to you, curled up tight. Tell your baby bunny, “Sweet dreams and good night.” (I will read you a story about this in tomorrow’s morning video.)

Physical Activity: Go Noodle: Peanut Butter in a Cup. Go through twice if you want!
