

Thursday, March 19th:

PK3

Religion: Practice the “Our Father” using motions that were taught in class and the Sign of the Cross.

ELA: Please have your child sing the alphabet and on the second time through have your child stop at the letter U. U is the Mousie picture to be colored and practiced (sent via their homework folder.) Mousie’s dress is blue and her ears and tail are to be colored pink. It is the paper where Mousie falls inside of the red umbrella.

Math: Please continue to practice the ABAB and AABB patterning exercises by use of cereal, buttons, forks and spoons, etc.

Science: Children can review the “My Big World” about teeth care and complete the backside, circling foods that are healthy for their teeth.

Social Studies: Continue to practice using manners and role-playing with stuffed animals, puppets and dolls. Children can have the dolls/stuffed animals/puppets “talk” to each other, using eye contact and nice words and gestures.

Physical Activity: “Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes.” Also the children like to pretend that they are Skippy John Jones, a Siamese cat who is confused and thinks that he is a puppy. We used to play it in the gym and it made them quite happy! It’s a chasing game. Basically you chase them around the home and you say, “I am not a Siamese cat, I am a chihuahua dog!” Siblings can play this together.
