

Monday, April 20th

PK3

Religion: Continue practicing the “Our Father” and the “Hail Mary” using motions as seen through teaching videos. Continue to practice making the Sign of the Cross. Tomorrow I will be teaching you the “Angel of God” prayer in its entirety, with motions that will help you to remember the words better.

ELA: Little Bitty Mousie will discover a baby’s Truckie and she will try to take a ride. Our letter of the week is the letter T. In our journals we will try to draw a simple toy truck using what we have learned about squares, rectangles and circles. I will show you a simple example of this in our morning video. We will also review the T song that goes along with our Jolly Phonics program, relating to a tennis game.

Math: We will review AABB patterns tomorrow. Practice making AABB patterns with two different colored objects, with a total of ten objects. We will learn to raise our arms up and down as if they were hummingbird wings to the count of 20, because today will be the 20th day of April. Line 3 stuffed animals up and continue to touch and say, “First, in the middle/ or 2nd, and last.” Continue to practice with one to one correspondence counting to the number ten. This will be shown with the ocean seashell demonstration board in tomorrow’s video. Children should have 10 objects that they can count and touch of their own.

Science/Social Studies: Practice with two stuffed animals asking and answering questions. They should face each other and use nice eye contact. Gentle Grover and Get-Along Big Bird will be demonstrating this.
