<u>PK3</u>

Religion: Continue to practice both the "Our Father" and the "Hail Mary ' with motions. We will be adding the song" Glory be to the Father" as sung through teaching video. Help your children to see the wonder in the world all around: budding trees, birds who chirp to wake us up from slumber, gorgeous blue skies, yellow warming rays: Proof that God is still always among us. ELA: We are backtracking a bit on "Little Bittie Mousie" simply because there were letters that still had not been covered. For tomorrow, Tuesday, and for Wednesday as well, we are concentrating on the letter Q, when the Mousie finds a shiny quarter lying on the floor that a child had left behind. In our journals we will draw a large capital Q. We should draw a large oval in journals and then insert a slanted horizontal dash to then turn it into a capital Q. In our morning video you will be able to see how the letter Q has U always with it, its regular spelling friend. Please have your child trace over the letter Q which he/she drew with three different colors of crayons, saying "Quuu" as they do so.In teaching video tomorrow there will be many concrete examples from around the home that I have gathered and hope your child might find one or two of their own examples of Qq items in your very home. That is a challenge I have found, there are not very many, do what you can! (Optional....)

Math Please have your child gather 25 assorted items and then place them into a large central pile. Then have your child count those 25 pieces as a whole number of 25 and say "25." Afterwards have your child count and separate this main group of 25 objects into 5 separate piles, so that there are still 25 pieces altogether, but now separated into 5 main different categories (groupings.)

Science/Social Studies: To connect with the letter Q, I will be reading your child the nursery rhyme about "Mary, Mary, Quite Contrary" which aligns with our Haggerty Phonics. Perhaps you could You Tube "Mary, Mary Quite Contrary: Preschool, You Tube." as an enrichment piece afterwards. Thank you so much for all of your interaction and support. I so miss the children! Your help has been integral as far as making these weeks "happen" so that we are learning/ relearning/ reconnecting/ and mostly, being kept close always in our hearts.
