# PK3

**Religion:** Continue to practice the "Angel of God" prayer. Close your eyes and try to feel your special chosen Guardian Angel landing on your shoulder. Touch your shoulder and say out loud, "Thank you for being here for me."

**ELA:** Try to collect 10 items from around your home that begin with the sound of T. Place those ten objects in a main container and first count them saying the numbers one through ten aloud. Then place all 10 items back into the container and once again pull them out singly, saying the name of the Tt word and stressing the sound of "tttttt" afterwards.

Math: I will review with you some of the important positional words that we began to learn in our Preschool classroom. I will show you how to use props to practice with words that show "above", "below", "in between', "in the middle", and "next to." There's a related Seesaw activity that is assigned that connects with this. Also yesterday's story that I read to you, "The Tortoise and the Hare" included great positional words. Those words included: over, around, across, into, through, up and down, under, and nearer, which means closer.

Science/Social Studies: I have shown you many antiques that I have collected over the years. Do you have any item that is pretty old in your home? Ask your parents for help on this one. Could you show it and talk about it by way of Seesaw? Tell me what it is, how old it is, and the story behind it. I would be thrilled to see that.

Physical Activity: Hop on 1 foot for 10 seconds. Switch feet and hop for 10 seconds. Do it again with each foot. Lie on your stomach and hold your hands and feet up in the air like you are flying for 10 seconds. Do it again. Lie on your back, sit up and touch your toes 10 times. Rest and do it again.
